Driving onto the School Site

As a result of the building works we continue to have very limited parking space at school for vehicles. Parents are not permitted to drive into school and drop off their children. Please can I ask those visiting the school for any reason, to park outside of the gates and walk in. Many of our staff are having to park outside because of the building work as well. Cars bringing children into school during the start and the end of the day, parking near or across the school entrance or performing U turns on the main road, cause a significant risk to the health, safety and well being of our students, and I would ask that everyone please considers this when driving to school. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Uniform Reminder

Below you will see a link to the school's uniform list which clearly outlines our expectations with regards to school uniform. There are no real changes this year but please remember as the weather begins to change that students are only permitted to wear black, navy or dark grey coats. Any other colour will be confiscated.

Last year we had a number of students wearing trainers to school despite the school's policy being clear that students must wear appropriate school shoes. This year we have purchased a large number of school shoes and any pupil coming to school wearing trainers without a medical note, will be expected to wear a pair of our shoes each day. We will have antibacterial spray and ensure the shoes are in good order. Students refusing to wear the shoes will be isolated until they are wearing appropriate footwear.

A quick reminder that we have removed the need for Year 11 students to wear blazers and they must wear a plain black V neck jumper instead. Any jumper other than a plain black V neck will be confiscated.

Please support the school and your children by ensuring they have the appropriate uniform at all times.

Email Policy and Change of Domain Name

Just a reminder that staff are not expected to check or use emails between 7pm and 7am on weekdays or at all at weekends and therefore parents are asked to refrain from emailing staff outside of these hours.

The Building Project

As you know our building project has been delayed and the facilities we were promised at the end of last academic year are far from ready. This is completely outside of the schools control, the project is being financed, managed and led by Essex County Council, and we have worked exceptionally hard to ensure there is limited impact on the students, their welfare and their learning. Essex have agreed to fund an extension to the schools' playing areas because of the major delay on the sports hall, but that is also delayed and will not be available for another 2-3 weeks. The Senior Team have provisions in place to allow space for students to be safe and release some energy at lunch time, however I want to apologise that the school is still not completed.

The new English block is now due to be completed by the end of this academic year with the sports hall following soon after. I will be meeting with the new developers in the next couple of weeks and will have a greater idea of the plan after that meeting.

I have been amazed by the way our pupils and staff have coped with the disruption caused by the building work and we will not let it impact upon the quality of education we provide. There is light at the end of the tunnel, our new music, science, technology and dining rooms are excellent facilities our pupils can enjoy and the other new builds will be back on track very soon. Thank you to all of you for your patience and support.

My Ed App - Never Miss a School Report or Letter Again!

The reason for this is that the system will link your child/children to your MyEd account automatically based on the information we hold and the information that you enter when signing up. This is also where the security codes will be sent to for the initial configuration of the App. If your contact information has changed please let the school know of these details via the admin email before signing up for the App.
