Hackney Half Marathon raises money for Camp International trip to Kenya:

West Hatch teachers Ms Edwards and Ms Lowry, took part in the Hackney Half Marathon to raise



money for the Camp International trip to Kenya this summer.

Ms Edwards finished in 1hr 51mins and Ms Lowry in 2hrs 14mins.

Ms Lowry said: "This is the first time I have run a half-marathon. It was so painful - an experience that I have never had before! But we are getting closer to the total for the funds that we have to raise for the trip so we are very excited."



Each of the 34 students has to raise £3,780 while the teachers have to raise funds for additional expenses. Fundraising has included bag packing at Sainsbury's in South Woodford, washing cars, selling cakes and entering fun runs, bike rides and half marathons. The students will spend a month restoring and rebuilding facilities in local communities. They will also teach English at village schools and run sports clubs.

Students will also be challenged by trekking in the mountains. Ms Lowry said: "We will be Ambassadors for West Hatch in Africa as well as taking part in the experience of a lifetime." Sixth Former Rhys Maslen, who finished in 1hr 37mins 28secs, said: "I got a great sense of fulfilment when I completed the Hackney Half Marathon. I'm now very excited and looking forward to the 2016 London Marathon which I've signed up for!"

BOYS FOOTBALL - Staff victorious: West Hatch staff retained the Jon 'Ottis' Redding Shield when they took on the students at Old Chigwellians. A defensive error led to Eren Muti giving the



students the lead with ten minutes gone and shortly after the break they were two up when Antione Milla's free kick trickled under the wall into the bottom corner. However the staff remained undeterred. A Will Hutchins mishap led to the ball being cut back to Ray Flowers who got the staff back into the game. Moments later the staff levelled at 2-2 when Billy Healy (back from his trainee year last term) nodded home a header. ATHLETICS - Success at national competition: Fifty-five students competed in the National Track and Field Cup competition at Lea Valley Athletics Centre when they faced tough competition against some of the region's top seven athletics schools including Emerson Park and Chingford Foundation.





The inter-girls team (Years 9 and 10) were the most successful West Hatch team finishing third while the Junior Boys, Girls and Senior Boys finished fifth, fourth and fourth respectively.

Year 9 pupil Jake Groce scored the most school points (46 points), 24 of which were achieved with an outstanding 1.75m high jump (county standard). Mariellen Teubes (Year 8) also had an exceptional performance contributing 40 points.

PE teacher Aaron D'Silva said: "All students worked very hard all day and were a credit to the school."
