
A Level Spanish at West Hatch High School



In A Level Spanish you will explore technological and social changes, looking at the multicultural nature of the Spanish-speaking world. You will study highlights of its culture, regional identities and socio-political as well as intellectual aspects of Spanish-speaking countries. Spanish is the third most widely spoken language, and the countries in which it is spoken include an incredible variety of cultures. Studying A-Level Spanish provides a fantastic opportunity to improve your linguistic skills and learn about Spain and Latin America. It is ideal for students who have a passion for languages or who want to enrich their main area of study with a second language. The A Level specification builds on the knowledge, understanding and skills gained at GCSE. It constitutes an integrated study with a focus on language, culture and society. It fosters a range of transferable skills including communication, critical thinking, research skills and creativity, which are valuable to the individual and society. The approach is a focus on how Spanish-speaking society has been shaped socially and culturally and how it continues to change.
