Bookbuzz is a reading programme which gives students the opportunity to choose and keep their own book from a list of specially-selected titles.

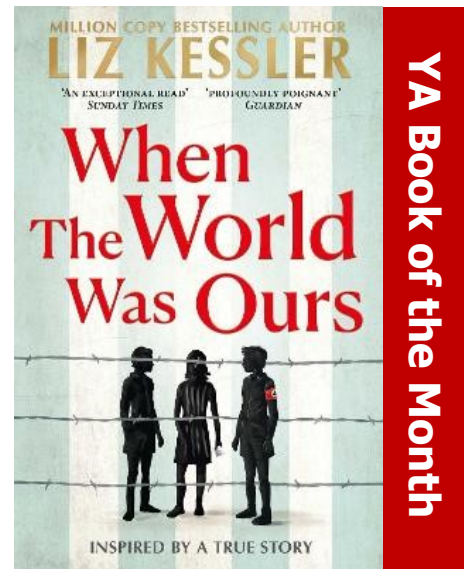
Year 7 students chose their free book before half term. They have all been ordered and should be here any day now!

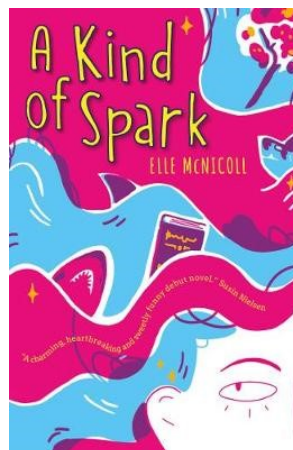
Blue Peter Best Story Award 2021
