National Reading Champions Quiz 2022

As part of our World Book Day celebrations we entered the National Reading Champions Quiz for the first time. The students were so excited to be taking part in a national competition and there was a real buzz around the library. It was great to see how both teams had prepared and worked together on this Quiz and they should all be extremely proud of their achievements!



The two West Hatch teams competed against 22 teams from 13 schools in the area during the heats on 17th March. All teams showcased their skilful ability to identify the characters, authors and titles of some of the most well-loved stories. The quiz consisted of 80 questions – eight different categories with ten questions each

Team A scored 56/80 and narrowly missed out as runners up but **Team B (pictured below) scored an impressive 61/80 to be crowned joint winners with Harris Academy.**

Team B will now be heading to the grand final on 25 May in London to compete with schools from across the UK to be crowned the National Reading Champions 2022.

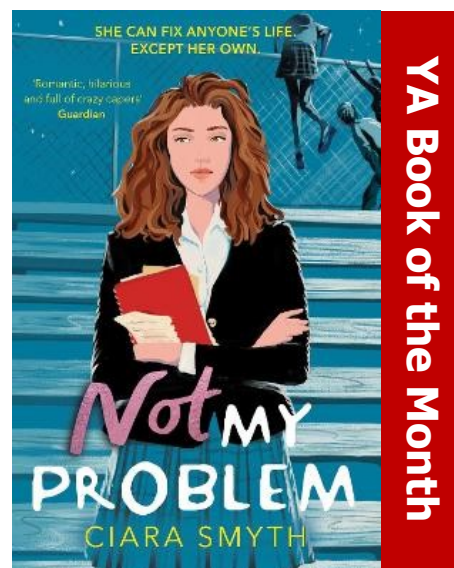
