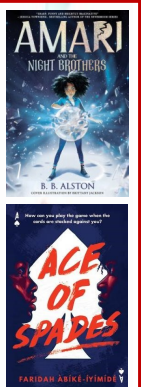

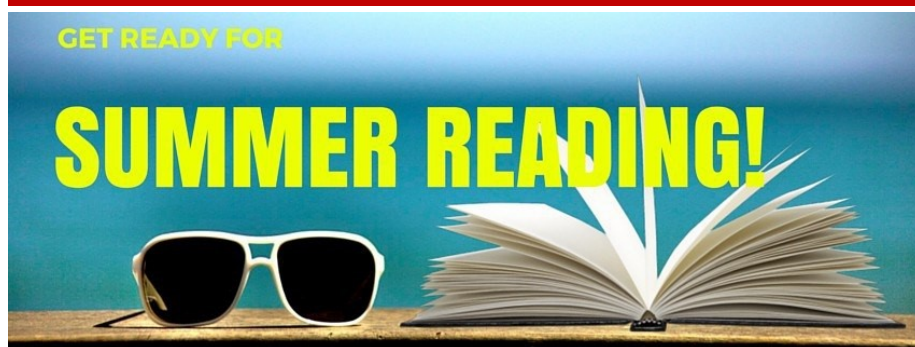

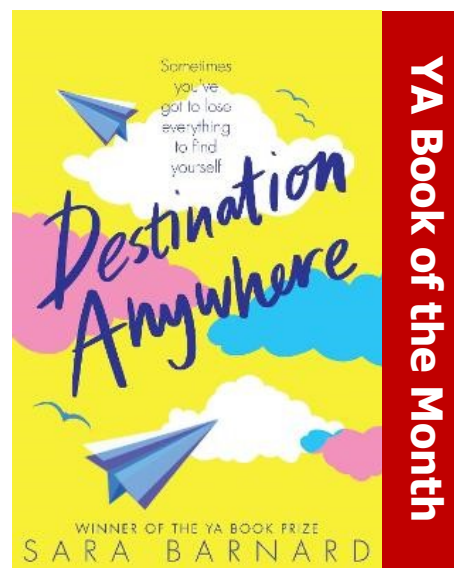
Summer Reading
