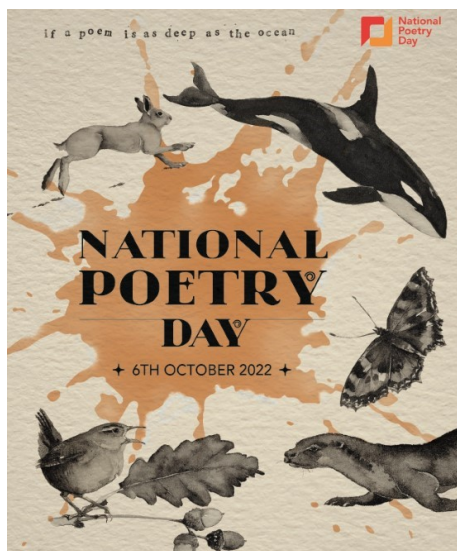

**The Environment**



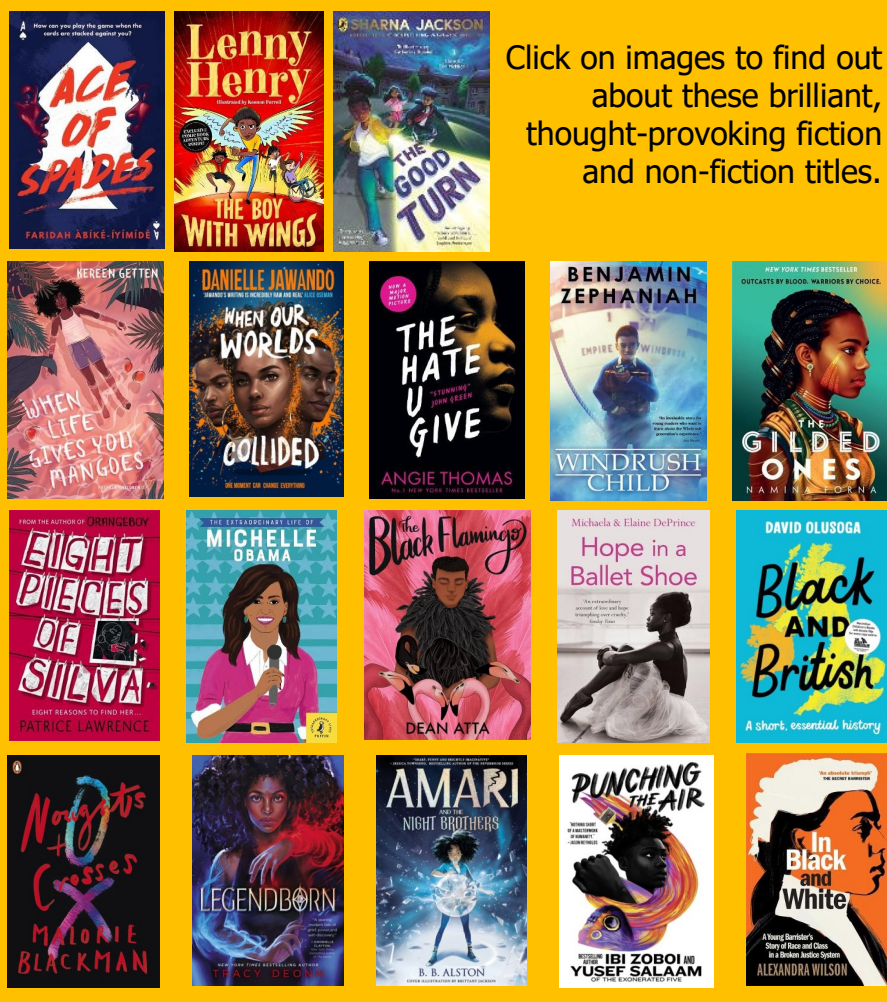
## Black History Month

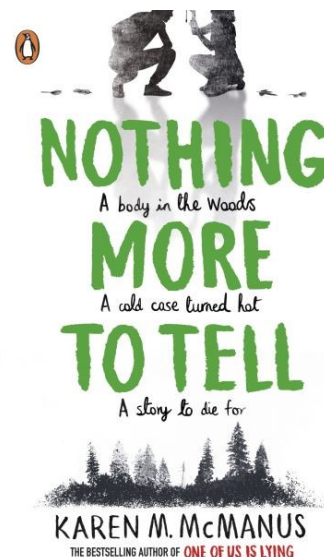
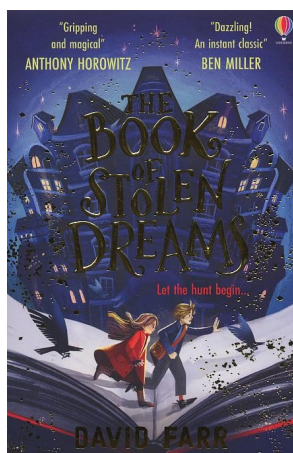
